FROM THE DESK OF THE PRESIDING MINISTER

Dear Members and Friends:

Was there some intimation of the spirit that caused The Church for The Fellowship of All Peoples to invite transgender warrior Leslie Feinberg to be the speaker for our 12th Annual Howard Thurman Convocation in celebration of our 63rd Anniversary? How could we have known that the time would be ripe, propitious for us to be led by this outstanding national leader? It is, I believe, confirmation of our growing edge of spiritual engagement that gave us insight into needing to hear from this precious community that continues to be denied basic human rights and protections.

From its beginning in 1944 as the nation's first avowedly and fully interracial, interfaith congregation, Fellowship Church has committed its resources to developing a religious fellowship that expands and deepens experiences of unity, thereby, subverting the divisiveness in society. We dedicate ourselves to being a rallying point for all in search of the common good and ground of humanity. We challenge any binding social classification that takes precedence over the intrinsic worth of the individual.

The convocation is a forum for strengthening our resolve by applying insights of the spirit to contemporary questions and issues. Author, activist, award-winning journalist Dr. Feinberg understands the intersection of oppressions. Ze has devoted hir life to dismantling economic, gender, LBGT, racial and other forms of exploitation and degradation. Starr King School for The Ministry awarded hir an honorary doctorate earlier this year. Dr. Feinberg address is entitled: "Solidarity: Building Bridges of Unity."

Ze is also the recipient of the Howard Thurman Award. The award is given annually to an individual or persons, embodying the life and legacy of Dr. Thurman, search for common ground.

Music will be provided by the celebrated Lucy Kinchen Chorale, known for its exquisitely disciplined, inspirational, passionate, and deeply moving performances of the Negro Spirituals. Internationally acclaimed pianist Dr. Carl Blake will also provide music.

BIOGRAPHIES

DR. LESLIE FEINBERG - Leslie Feinberg is a long-time activist and an award-winning author. Her works include *Stone Butch Blues*, *Drag King Dreams*, *Transgender Warriors: Making History from Joan of Arc to Dennis Rodman* and *Trans Liberation: Beyond Pink or Blue*.

Feinberg is a political journalist and a managing editor of Workers World newspaper. Ze is a national steering committee member of the LGBT Caucus of the National Writers Union, UAW Local 1981; a member of Pride at Work, AFL-CIO; and an associate member of the steelworkers Union. Feinberg is a founder of Rainbow Flags for Mumia and a national organizer for the International Action Center.

Please allow me to introduce myself. My name is Leslie Feinberg – you can call me Les. I am a masculine, lesbian, female-to-male cross-dresser and transgenderist. Because I was raised as a female in this woman-hating society, my consciousness has been shaped by some to the experiences that girls and women of all nationalities generally share in the dominate society. In addition, being a very masculine female has also subjected me to experiences that neither non-trans women or men face....

So I end as I began: My name is Les Feinberg.... I believe that I – and my communities – can be important allies for you The only question is: Have we reached the moment in history when this dialogue between communities can begin?

LUCY KINCHEN CHORALE - dedicated to renewing awareness and appreciation of the Negro Spiritual, one of America's original and most beautiful art forms, the Lucy Kinchen Chorale was established in September of 2001 and performs in the San Francisco Bay Area. Ms. Kinchen has astounded audiences with her chorale, which is diverse in age, ethnicity, and cultural backgrounds. The unique chorale not only exemplifies the passionate music of the Spirituals, but a variety of repertoires. With exceptional artistry, their intensely expressive performance will lift your heart and spirit.

DR. CARL BLAKE – holds three degrees in piano performance, the Bachelor of Music from Boston University, the Master of Arts from San Jose State University, and the Doctor of Musical Arts from Cornell University. He is the first recipient of the Marian Anderson Young Artist Award (presented by Ms. Anderson herself). As a concert artist, he has performed on national and international venues and has appeared three times at Carnegie Recital Hall. Dr. Blake is the former Associate Director of Arts and Humanistic Studies and Assistant Dean of the College of Arts and Architecture at Penn State University. He has twice received a Fulbright Scholar Award to teach and perform in Honduras.


